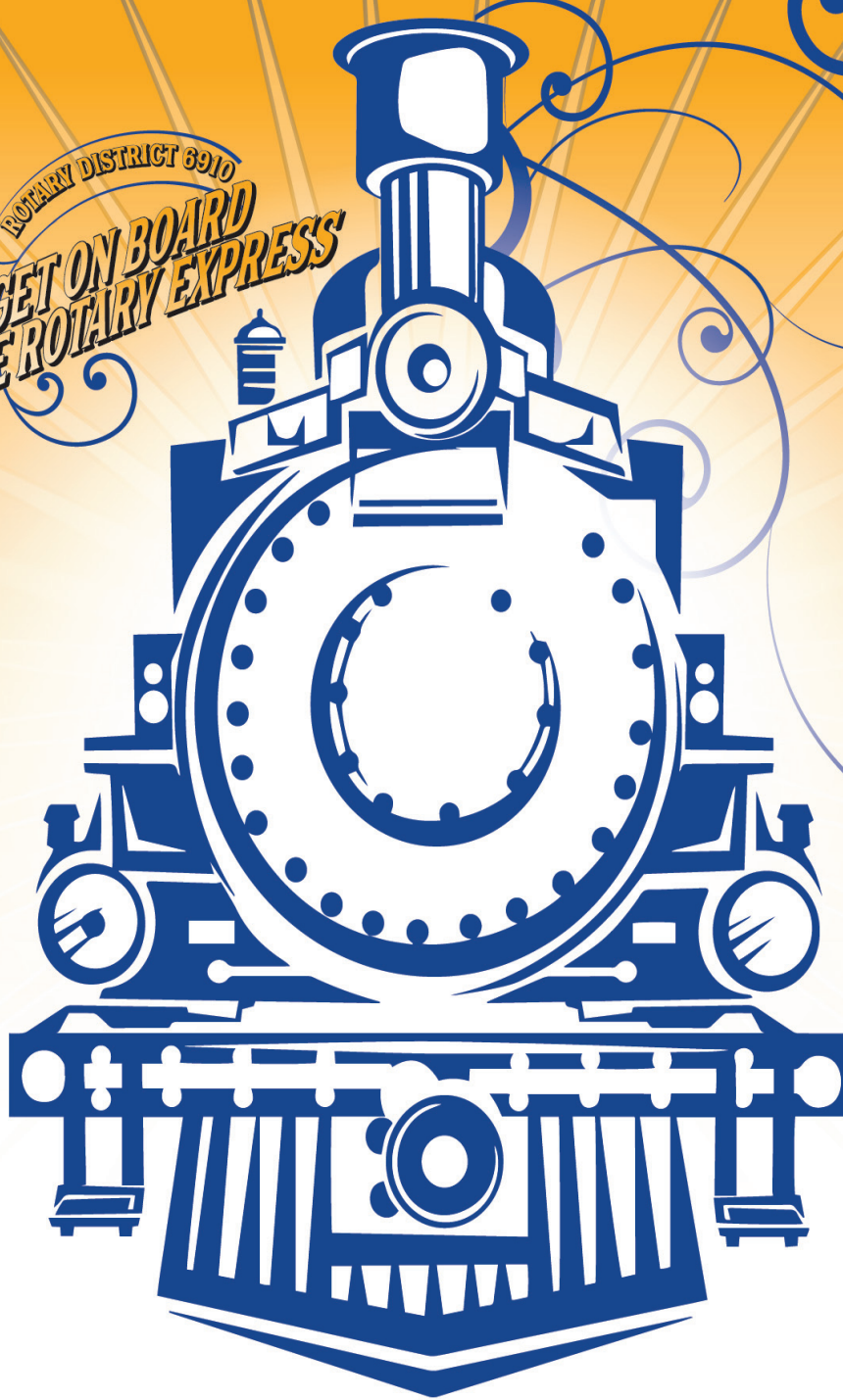

SPEAKER

Mark Brainard

Southern Railway Historical Association's Archive Center

Mark Brainard's passion for the railroads began back in 1977 when he worked as a ticket clerk for Amtrak at Montgomery, Birmingham, and Nashville. During 1980-88, he was employed at the Southern Railway, later the Norfolk Southern Steam Locomotive Department, as a locomotive fireman and mechanic. He traveled extensively across the South on steam locomotives that pulled passenger excursion trains.



Mark has also served as President of the Louisville & Nashville Railroad Historical Society and Operations Officer at the Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum. Mark's love of the railroads has resulted in him doing in-depth research into the 19th century railroads of Chattanooga for book projects and articles with occasional speaking engagements on the Great Locomotive Chase and other Civil War railroad topics to Civil War Roundtable meetings, and the National Civil War Trust's Chattanooga Convention. He has accumulated newspaper articles related to railroads in the Chattanooga area that date from the 1820's to 1913.

Mark is a volunteer at the Southern Railway Historical Association's Archive Center and was appointed as Archive Manager in 2023.

Patti Childers

Chattanooga-Hamilton County Family Justice Center

Patti has been with the Chattanooga Hamilton County Family Justice Center (FJC) for over 7 years and is the Assistant Director of Outreach, Training, and Volunteers. Patti is a Chattanooga native who graduated from Ooltewah High School, and went on to obtain her Bachelors of Social Work from UTC, and is a licensed Social Worker in the state of Tennessee. She utilizes her skills in project management and coordination of multidisciplinary groups to support survivor and service organizations. Through the coordination of these groups, Patti identifies, creates, and executes training for community agencies, law enforcement, FJC partners, civic organizations, schools and the faith community.



Building the recruitment and retention of volunteers is among one of her primary roles and is critical to the success of the FJC. Among Patti's list of accomplishments is coordination and implantation of FJC conferences including the first two totally virtual conferences. Patti spoke at the 20th Annual Tennessee Coalition to End Domestic and Sexual Violence on Compassion Fatigue in 2022. Patti presents on Mindfulness and Compassion Fatigue to agencies locally and statewide. She serves on the TN Valley Regional Advisory Board for Nurture the Next.

Alan Clark

District Governor – District 6780

Alan Clark of the Rotary Club of Franklin County A.M. is the District 6780 District Governor for 2022-2023. Alan joined the Rotary Club of Winchester in 1980. He is a Past President of the Winchester Rotary Club and Past President and Executive Secretary of the Franklin County A.M. Rotary Club. He was named the Rotarian of the Year in the Winchester Club for 2007-2008 and was the Assistant District Governor for Area 12 (Franklin County, Winchester, Monteagle-Sewanee, and Grundy County.) He served five years on the District's Rotary Youth Exchange committee and in roles as Youth Exchange Coordinator and Advisor. He is a Paul Harris Fellow, member of Paul Harris Society, and Rotary Benefactor.



He served 28 years in the military and retired in 2000, having been awarded the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star, and Honorable Order of Saint Barbara. He is a veteran of the Persian Gulf War and retired as a Colonel from the US Army Training and Doctrine Command.

Following military retirement, he began a career as an Education Technology and Information Technology professional, serving in several Chief Information Technology Officer roles.

Clark was the editorial columnist for the Winchester (TN) Herald-Chronicle and editorial page contributor to the Columbia (TN) Daily Herald. In 2019 he received a Tennessee Press Association Award for Best Editorials.

A lifelong sports enthusiast, Alan has been a sports broadcaster following his playing days. He was staff reporter for the Univ of Tennessee Vol Network and the Voice of Covenant College basketball in Lookout Mountain, GA. He does play-by-play for local high school teams in Winchester, Huntland, Tullahoma, and Moore County (Lynchburg). He now serves as General Manager and Sports Director for Wiseman Media and WZYX Radio in Cowan, TN.

Clark lives in Estill Springs, Tennessee, with beautiful wife Shirley Maxwell Clark. He still plays racquetball, tennis, golf, enjoys travel, music, kayaking, and boating on Tims Ford Lake, and plays drums and bass guitar in his spare time.

**Past Rotary International President
(2016-2017)**

John F. Germ is the retired board chair and CEO of Campbell & Associates Inc., consulting engineers. He joined the firm as an engineer in 1965 after four years in the U.S. Air Force. He has served on the boards of several organizations, including the Chattanooga-Hamilton County Hospital Authority Board of Trustees, and as board chair of the Public Education Foundation, Orange Grove Center Inc., the Miracle League Chattanooga, and Blood Assurance Inc. He is founder and treasurer of the Chattanooga State Technical Community College Foundation and president of the Tennessee Jaycee Foundation. He is also the founder of Camp Discovery, a camp for intellectually and developmentally disabled individuals.



Germ was awarded the Tennessee Young Man of the Year in 1970; Engineer of the Year in 1976; Volunteer Fundraiser of the Year in 1992 and Tennessee Community Organization's Volunteer of the Year in 2009. He is recipient of the Boy Scouts Silver Beaver Award and the Arthritis Foundation Circle of Hope Award.

Germ joined Rotary in 1976 and has served RI as president in 2016-17, vice president, director, Foundation trustee and vice chair, aide to the Foundation trustee chair, chair of Rotary's \$200 Million Challenge, RI Board Executive Committee member, chair of numerous committees, area coordinator, and RI training leader. In 2013, the White House recognized him as a Champion of Change.

Germ has received Rotary's Service Above Self Award and the Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service and Rotary Foundation Distinguished Service Award. He and his wife, Judy, are Foundation Benefactors and members of the Arch Klumph Society.

Alaa Hammouda

Rotary Peace Scholar (2020-2022)

Alaa Hammouda is a Rotary Peace Scholar, passionate advocate, storyteller, and program manager. She has worked in emergency and humanitarian settings on public health projects, women's empowerment issues, and gender equity in the Middle East.



Alaa has experience in print and broadcast media, advocacy, administration, public relations, social work, translation, and teaching. She worked at America-Mideast Educational and Training Services for two years, in addition to several media agencies like XINHUA, Middle East Eye, and Russia Today as a freelance journalist.

She served for four years as an Advocacy Media Officer at the Gaza Community Mental Health Programme, a pioneer organization providing psychological support for victims of human rights violations. During her career, she has advocated for women's rights, support for mental health, the fight to stop violence against women and children, gender equality, and human rights.

Alaa's interests in humanitarian health are a result of her own personal experience as a Palestinian young woman and a lifelong resident of the Gaza Strip. She has lived through three wars and been under siege for more than ten years. Despite these challenges, she has been able to advance her aspirations and continue to have hope for a peaceful future.

Jennifer's talents have strengthened Rotary's reach and impact as she has served in roles including vice president, director, Rotary Foundation trustee, and co-chair of the End Polio Now: Make History Today fundraising campaign.

Jennifer is a leader in cultivating experiential fundraising opportunities, such as a day of golfing with Rotary polio ambassador Jack Nicklaus in Jupiter, Florida, USA, that raised over \$5.25 million for polio eradication. She also led the innovative #RotaryResponds virtual event in May 2020, which raised money for COVID-19 relief projects and showcased how Rotary members were responding to the pandemic around the world.

Working alongside political figures, celebrities, and global leaders, Jennifer has raised awareness and hundreds of millions of dollars to eradicate disease, support peace, and provide clean water and sanitation. An expert storyteller, she inspires hope and promise and motivates people to take action.

Jennifer is a member of the Rotary Club of Windsor-Roseland in Ontario, Canada. She has received the Service Above Self Award and The Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service. She holds a Doctor of Laws (LL.D.) and has been recognized with the YMCA Peace Medal and the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal, and she was the first Canadian to receive Wayne State University's Community Peacemaker Award.

(2024-2025)**



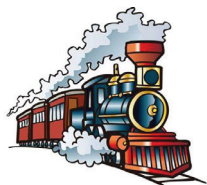

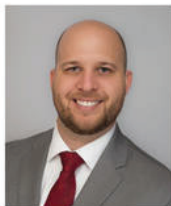
